## Telford Telescope: David L. Holmes Coach of Champions



Dr Keith Wunderlich has written a landmark book published by Wayne State University Press about his grandfather--Michigan Sports Hall of Fame coach David L. Holmes. At Wayne between 1917 and 1958, Coach Holmes

produced three Olympians, nine All-Americans, and the holders of many world records. In the 1956 U.S. Trials, he brought me one torn hamstring muscle away from making the Olympic team. The most remarkable thing about his panoramic success was that he lacked any decent athletic facilities for indoor track meets. He actually chalked a tilefloor hallway in the Old Main building and held sprints and hurdle races there. Longer-distance events were held on an elevated circular track in the men's gymnasium. The gym was so small it took 22 laps to make a mile. Pole vaulters had to start in the hallway and run through a set of double doors before they could enter that small gymnasium for their jump. Shot putters heaved a 16-pound shot onto the floor of the little gym, which had science labs on the level below.

Over the years, I have done my best to make sure that Coach Holmes and the great athletes he coached aren't forgotten. Only a very few of us remain ro tell the amazing story, of Coach Holmes' truly incredible achievements. More than a century ago, he started all the sports programs at what was then called Detroit Junior College. During those four decades, he coached track & field and was the college's athletic director.. He used the hallways of Old Main for practice and track meets because he had no other facilities. His outdoor track was as inadequate as were his indoor facilities--without enough space for a full 440-yard track--and syn-



thetic tracks weren't even a dream back then. We ran on dirt and cinders.

During Coach Holmes' years at Wayne, racism and antisemitism were common, but he welcomed everyone. When our team traveled out-of-state for track meets, he wouldn't allow us to be split up. We ate together and slept in the same hotels. If a restaurant wouldn't serve one of us, everybody left and went somewhere that would. Coach Holmes was a second father to countless young men, students and athletes alike--but he was far more than a great athletic coach--he was a truly great man.

In 1957, John Telford was unbeaten at 200 and 400 meters competing in Europe on the United States Track Team. he later followed in Holmes' footsteps to coach champions.
